#### Spring collection was in the online space

Despite the closed temples due to the pandemic of COVID-19, you could help those in need through a collection in the online space on the Caritas Slovakia's page and the diocesan and archdiocesan caritas' pages. The collection was a very important resource of financing approximately 300 facilities and services which through Caritas help the needy all over Slovakia. Many of these facilities were experiencing serious existential problems due to the pandemic, many in the case of persistent situation were threatened that they would have to limit their services.


## We set up a toll-free number and helped with registration for vaccination

Caritas Slovakia launched a free telephone line 0800 222 250 for seniors or people without access to internet where they could, with the help of assistants, sign up for vaccination against the coronavirus. Diocesan and eparchial caritas, in some cases also accompanied or provided transportation for the seniors. Initiative was implemented in cooperation with the Bishops Conference of Slovakia and the Godzone project.



## In cooperation with Bishops Conference of Slovakia, we announced a fundraiser to help people in need in the Middle East

The Bishops Conference of Slovakia announced a nationwide collection to help people in need in the Middle East region. The importance of our help to persecuted Christians and refugees in these countries pointed out also Pope Francis during his visit to Iraq which marked the 10th anniversary of the beginning of the ongoing armed conflict in Syria, which we remembered in those days.



#### Dm has been helping families in need for ten years

Ten years, 44,000 diaper vouchers worth 440,000 euros for 1400 families - that's the ten-year balance of the implementation of the Let's Help project children, which dm drogerie markt organizes in cooperation with various charities organizations. The current tenth year was again organized in cooperation with us and supported 156 families in it. Each of them received an annual supply of diapers in the form of 32 vouchers for purchasing diapers of brand babylove.



#### In difficult times, we also think of homeless people

Food blogger Lucia Randová together with the chef from Bao Brothers Michal Konrád prepared lunch menu for homeless people. This consisted of vegetable soup, bao buns with pork belly stew and smoked knee and doughnuts with plum jam. The three-course meal was served in a low threshold Center Domec in Bratislava.



## National Week of Caritas revealed the stories of help from Bratislava to Košice

From May 29th until June 5th, we celebrated the National Week of Caritas. An event, whose aim is to draw attention to socially dependent people and people in need, presented their stories as well as the importance of the services provided by Caritas Slovakia. A novelty of the event was the Run for Caritas. Its aim was to remind the participants of the amount of effort and will that be demonstrated by people in need on the way out of a difficult situation. The Run was supported by well-known sprinter and Slovak record holder Ján Volko.



#### Open Days in Caritas Garden in Kapitulska

During the Open Days, which took place on June 25-27, Caritas Slovakia also opened its doors. In the Caritas Garden on Kapitulska 18 under the city walls, the visitors recognized foreign projects helping people affected by war and persecution. Resting under the canopy of trees, knowledge of life beyond the borders of our country and the taste of prized coffee Golden grain - all of it was offered for the visitors in the Caritas Garden, which is gradually gaining in beauty – also under the hands of our clients from the victim of human trafficking assistance project.



## Collection to help the southern Moravia after a devastating disaster

To help people in southern Moravia who were suddenly affected by devastating tornado, Caritas Slovakia collected more than 2 million Czech crowns. It was an immense manifestation of humanity and solidarity, which was referred to not only by the amount of donation but also the speed with which people from Slovakia managed to mobilize. Our local partner - Diocesan Caritas Brno supervised the specific use of the donation.



## The fruits of the Holy Father's visit in Slovakia was a collection for Cuba

On September 26, 2021, all Slovak churches held a collection to help the needy in Cuba. The collection was one of the fruits of Holy Father's visit to Slovakia, who repeatedly draws attention to brothers and sisters who are struggling, however, remain overlooked. Cuba's problems have been exacerbated by the global coronavirus pandemic. The situation of increasing material poverty in this country was for us a reminder that we have much to be thankful for, and at the same time we should not overlook those who are not equally fortunate.



## Christmas campaign with the message: Help is the fulfillment we seek

We all wish for something under the Christmas tree. However, the desire of some lies in the smallest and most precious: in help. Devote help to people in need and you could experience the real spirit of Christmas from November 15th to December 31st. The ambassador of the collection was a well-known presenter Veronika Cifrová Ostrihoňová. The campaign was organized by Caritas Slovakia in cooperation with 10 dioceses and archdioceses caritas that jointly operate 345 facilities and services for people in need throughout Slovakia.



#### Three awards of social service for Caritas

In the second half of the year, they appreciated people working in the social sector. Director of Caritas Spiš Mr. Pavol Vilček took home the DOBRÉ SRDCE national care award. The social act of the year was a reason for joy in the Greek Caritas of Prešov. Ms. Helenka Paňková, head of the House of St. Faustinas, took the award over from the hands of the Minister of Labor, Social affairs, and Family Mr. Milan Krajniak. 3rd award was won in Nitra, where director of the Caritas Nitra Mr. Ing. Mgr. Juraj Barat became one of the personalities of the city.



## STOP Human Trafficking

In 2021, the STOP human trafficking project continued in its activities in an alternately limited regime caused by pandemic measures.

The main pillar of the project has been **the reintegration of victims back to the society** for the 13th year of project's existence. Caritas Slovakia has been implementing the reintegration in partnership with the Greek Caritas of Prešov. Caritas took care of 11 new clients in 2021 and provided care to a total of 24 clients during the year. 8 victims were eliminated.

The continuation of the pandemic situation was likely to impact the implementation of **pre-return assistance and those assisted of voluntary returns** of victims of human trafficking which was implemented in smaller numbers before the pandemic. Pre-return assistance was provided to **11** Slovak citizens from other countries United Kingdom (3), Ireland (2), Germany (2), Czech Republic (1), Italy (1), Austria (1) and Slovakia (1), of which 4 were women (form of exploitation: sexual exploitation, forced labor) and 7 men (form of exploitation: forced labor, serfdom, and unknown form). Assisted voluntary return was finally realized for 2 of these them from the United Kingdom, for 1 man, form of exploitation: forced labor and 1 woman who was sexually exploited.

We, in cooperation with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, again helped train 25 future consuls sent to embassies of the Slovak Republic abroad.

We also continued to operate the National Helpline of Victim of human trafficking (0800 800 818) and throughout the year we recorded a total of 528 calls. A total of 186 people called the line, some repeatedly, of which 92 men, 90 women and 4 children. We solved 4 calls to identify potential victims of human trafficking.

**Prevention and education** in face-to-face form continued to be significantly limited. It was only during the relaxation of the measures that we managed to follow up for the prevention of vulnerable groups such as homeless people, foreigners, or clients of the asylum center. Within the framework of the cooperation which started with The Slovak Humanitarian Council, we continued to provide education in prevention of human trafficking for the asylum seekers in Slovakia. And as part of long-term cooperation with DePaul Slovakia there are also talks for clients in dormitories in Bratislava, which we managed to realize for three groups.

Caritas Slovakia was the guarantor of the nationwide campaign Red Ribbons. We also continued our regular meetings of the non-profit platform Civil Society Platform against Human Trafficking in Brussels, which due to the pandemic, took place online. We participated in various online webinars and workshops. A new and urgent topic for us was the multi-day training called "Protection of children from sexual exploitation online- Introduction to the global issues of live broadcasting of sexual exploitation of children", which was organized by the RENATE network.

The annual activity of our project is "Day of St. Bakhita", which took place on February 8, when we commemorate the victims of human trafficking. It is International Day of Prayer and awareness of human trafficking, identified by the Pope Francis in 2015 - on the day of the liturgical memory of St. Josephine Bakhita, patron of victims of human trafficking. Prayers took place online and via studio recording in Radio Lumen. We invite as many parishes as possible to the prayer every time, as our ambition is to make this initiative of Holy Father expand as much as possible. This year we modified our invitation to participate in prayer through Radio Lumen and by preparing materials, so-called "Prayers in a Bubble". We supplemented the prayers and supplications with real stories of our clients this time as well to bring their fates closer together. We have also prepared extra activities for children so they could participate in a competition for symbolic gifts.



In the spring of 2021, we continued the campaign started before the pandemic (Don't get enslaved 2019) and created with the support of the British Embassy in Bratislava continuation of the preventive campaign aimed at the marginalized groups. This time it was a purely online campaign under titled You are not for sale which aimed to warn women and girls about the risks associated with sexual exploitation. It consisted of 3 short videos in which young women were addressed by: Petra Polnišová, rapper Ego and a former client Simona. In a short time, the videos reached 150,000 views.



On August 22, after a longer break due to the fall of the castle walls and global pandemic, we organized in a Caritas Garden in Kapitulska, Fair Fashion Event called **Fashion and/or trade** as third in the series (1. Fashion and/as Slavery, 2. Fashion and/as Waste). The event's aim was to gain awareness of textile industry practices within the so-called Fast fashion and at the same time sensitizing people to what is happening around them and in the world. The form of the fashion show served to attract attention and subsequent discussion with guests (Tomáš Horváth of sobi.eco, La Florita – slow fashion blogger, Igor Hanečák a.k.a. Recycler) explained how the supply chains of products that you use every day at work, we buy and what we can do to avoid exploitative practices that did not support in the given sector. Accompanying activities were Clothes bazaar, refreshments, and a workshop with original textile printing.

National Helpline for Victims of Human Trafficking 0800 800 818 operates on weekdays from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. and during business hours. The main partners of the helpline are the Ministry of the Interior of the Slovak Republic and Slovak Telekom, a.s.



The STOP human trafficking project, financed by the Ministry of Interior the Slovak Republic, helps victims with reintegration into the society, while providing comprehensive and long-term care. It ensures assisted voluntary returns and pre-return assistance. It also operates the National Helpline for Victims of Human Trafficking 0800 800 818.

## Parish caritas

In 2021 Caritas Slovakia in cooperation with archdiocesan, diocesan, and eparchial caritas successfully continued the project called:

## Building capacity to support charitable activities in parishes and communities.

The main donor of the project is Renovabis.

The parish caritas is the third pillar of the church in the parish and is pastoral parish community body whose task is to lead, coordinate, promote and testify love of neighbor by concrete deeds. It is a community of believing parish volunteers who carry out the charitable mission of the Church in the spirit of the Gospel commandments of love.



Volunteers working in their parish caritas are people, thanks to whom we can get to a specific person directly in parish that needs help. It is also unique in that the person who found himself in difficult life situation, in material, financial, relational or another need can turn to someone close to him. If the competencies of the parish caritas are not enough, then there are archdiocesan, diocesan, and eparchial caritas that can help a specific person in a targeted way.

The activity in 2021 were significantly affected by a pandemic situation during which parish volunteers were in the so-called first line of help. Some parish caritas (Parish caritas Sered, Parish caritas Dunajská Streda) were awarded the city's highest award for significant help during the pandemic.

#### Project results in 2021:

#### **Let's help children** project:

With the significant help of volunteers from parish caritas through our social workers in cooperation with our long-time partner - dm drogerie markt provided vouchers for diapers for families with many children in material need. Overall, we supported 96 families. Each family received a year's supply of diapers in in the form of 32 vouchers for purchasing babylove diapers.

"In a difficult life situation, any help is welcome, and that's why we are already for the 10th year in a row try to help children and their parents in some way by providing them with free babylove diapers. We are pleased that thanks to the recommendations of our colleagues, it reaches families, which really need it," said Janka Poláčková, procurator of the dm drogerie markt.

We appreciate very much that even the current crisis did not prevent dm drogerie markt and Caritas Slovakia continue to do the necessary diaper aid project Let's help children. Not only concrete material help, but also regular contacts with store employees and caritas workers help supported families in their difficult life situation. Thanks to the generosity of our partner, we can be close to a person in need.

#### The Giving Friday project:

Thanks to the dm drogerie markt initiative, we received a financial support of more than 49,500 euros. Thanks to this significant financial support of dm drogerie markt, we could historically create and technically equip 15 Caritas educational centers for people in need for the first time in Slovakia. The aim of these centers is to make retraining courses available to people, so that they can participate fully in life, find a job, to educate themselves in the field of financial literacy and at the same time we provide special social assistance in these centers. Also, we work with children in the forms of various tutoring.

## Development of social services and education

## Train to care project – educational program for caregivers

Eight years of cooperation with Austrian Caritas through its agency Caritas Rundum Zuhause betreut created a proven concept of additional education for caregivers. The program of courses we offer is designed to develop not only their professional side, but also their personal side.

Additional education is intended for independent nurses and caregivers, as well as employees of the field nursing service, caritas service in families, employees of day care centers and social service facilities. Also, external applicants have the option to sign up for courses if they take care of their family members at home.

In 2021, we organized 5 courses in which a total of 64 people participated. All graduates received a certificate of completion course. The course Kinesthetics in nursing and the course Validation belong among the sought-after professional courses. How not to burn out course and course Respectful communication is aimed at personality development as prevention of the burnout syndrome, which is experienced by working people.

#### **Education of caritas employees**

Caritas Slovakia has been active in recent years in dedicating to education and development of professional skills of all employees. A big news within the development of internal education is the launch of an educational program DECACERT. It is an ethical program for Christian organizations and a tool for ethical organization management. Its author and instructor is prof. DR. Elisabeth Jünemann. From September, the selected ones from dioceses started training lecturers, which after successful formation and certification will implement in their caritas facilities.

The goal is that our clients through our services have experienced the quality of Christian love that will define us. At the same time, we want to create an environment, in which our employees are treated well, they feel good and want to work for the Caritas.

## Services of Diocesan and Archdiocesan caritas

Caritas Slovakia aids through 10 arch/diocesan caritas. This assistance is provided to the citizens of all ages. Caritas Slovakia is also a member of the Association of nonpublic social service providers and regularly participates in the legislative setting of social services in the Slovak Republic, where it also uses its many years of experience and wide scope. Not only the directors of diocesan and archdiocesan caritas, but also selected employees work in several working groups, whether at the level of the state, or at the level of regions; they are members of umbrella groups and cooperate with other partner organizations.

A significant presence among other services is the sheltered workshop, which was operated by Caritas Nitra, in which they also issued material aid. The Greek Caritas of Prešov published the monthly magazine Cesta, in the Kahan Club cared for alcoholics who want to abstain and ran a tire service, a car wash, a laundromat and field social work. Caritas of Bratislava ran the Solidarity Center in Bratislava, provided food and material aid, help with online teaching, unregistered services (basic social counseling, crisis intervention field services, services for children and their families, community center, wardrobe). The Caritas of Trnava provided affordable home, affordable housing and clay ducat services.



# Caritas Slovakia distributed 45,000 school supplies to children in needs



The 12th year of the popular collection brought several novelties; we have expanded the number of collection points to 71 and we launched help through the so-called social scholarship. Not only several schools, municipalities, parishes and companies have participated in the collection, but especially hundreds of individuals who decided to support the idea of helping children. The patronage



of the collection was given by the mayor of Bratislava, the capital of Slovakia, Matúš Vallo and the representatives of Caritas Slovakia were received in the Presidential Palace and the President of the Slovak Republic Zuzana Čaputová herself not only donated several full school bags, but also financially supported social scholarship for schoolchildren, in which a total of €15,000 was collected.





## 89 tons of aid for people in need



Thanks to the Tesco food collection, people in need received food aid and basic toiletries. Tesco customers could go for the traditional food collection in Slovakia which involved all 154 chain stores from December 16th to 18th, 2021. Online version collections through the Tesco Online shopping service lasted until the end of December.


Despite the difficult situation, people donated 89 tons food and hygiene items worth almost 130,000 euros. The total financial value of all collected Tesco products was increased by 25%, namely by 33 thousand euros.

## **Development cooperation**

Our operations continued to focus on providing education for children and young people from the socially disadvantaged environment and social support of very poor families in sub-Saharan African countries. Although, the coronavirus pandemic had a significant impact on the operation and normal course of projects, we managed to extend Caritas aid to Moldova and Ethiopia.

## **Uganda**

In the north of Uganda, we treated 55 HIV positive patients at the Gift of Love center. The Caritas kindergarten had to remain closed due to the coronavirus for a year. However, the tailoring and carpentry workshop continued to function, and we managed to start a farming project for poor families.



In the Caritas workshop in Unna, we trained 21 tailors and 24 joiners and carpenters.



When the schools in Uganda closed, the children stayed at the Gift of Love center, were tutored by kindergarten teachers.



Near Adjumani, we started supporting efficient farming.

"Mom couldn't afford my studies with the little we had because of what I dropped out of school in seventh grade. Everything has changed when I heard about **St. Joseph vocational institute – Workshop of St. Josef.** I was accepted and I successfully completed the joinery and carpentry course."

#### Rwanda

In Rwanda, we are present through education at the Cultural Center of St.Vincent Pallotti which enabled another 115 children to attend preschool. We operate it in cooperation with the Pallottine order and local employees. Saturday tutoring is used by our graduates and minors with their parents work off the school fees by working nearby.



In the center in Kibeho, we prepared 36 children for school and hired 44 new kindergartners.



"I was without work for a long period of time and even in our family we had a difficult situation. When I heard that center for poor children from the neighborhood was opening in Kibeho, which will function as a kindergarten, I signed up immediately. Fortunately for me, I was chosen. I have to thank you and the Pallotins for that."

## **Ethiopia**

In Ethiopia, we participated in aid in the Tigray region, where civil strife is raging war through the Together for Ethiopia initiative. To support these suffering people, we set aside €10,000 from the Lenten Box collection.



We provided food, blankets and other basic equipment to the families threatened by the humanitarian crisis in the Tigray region.

#### Moldova

Thanks to financial support from Slovak Aid, we started a new project of development of ecological waste processing in a Moldovan town of Criuleni and surrounding villages. We managed to activate the residents who participated in several volunteer cleanings of public spaces and landfills in the vicinity.



In the town of Criuleni, thanks to a joint project with Caritas Czech Republic we compost kitchen waste in new containers.

## **Development Volunteering**

We regularly send volunteers interested in working with children and young people to project sites in Uganda and Rwanda. In 2021, 2 female volunteers and 3 male volunteers stayed here. The costs associated with volunteering were covered by the Lenten Box collection and Slovak Agency for International Development Cooperation (Slovak Aid).

We have prepared 2 online webinars for those interested in volunteering. Despite the pandemic, there was a high interest in the volunteering program - we received a total of 28 applications from all over Slovakia.

## **Syria**

We helped: 600+ people + 500,000 people hit online

**Value:** € 93,700

**We managed to:** support a kindergarten, a family center, a cultural institute, training and counseling center for women.

Many women lost their husbands and breadwinners as a result of conflicts and that is why we help to set up nurseries where mothers can leave their children as they acquire new skills in a training or counseling center. They learn to be hairdressers, beauticians and thus get a chance to earn a living for their family.

#### Iraq

We helped: 15,970+ people

**Succeeded:** complete the construction of 3 wells and start the construction of others 2 wells, ensure the installation of water filters and solar panels, support the construction of a nursery and kindergarten, fix the library.

In a country which is affected by combat operations of Daesh (the so-called Islamic state) since 2014, we help restore infrastructure and ensure access to drinking water. Thanks to the Slovak Aid project supported by Bishops Conference of Slovakia we managed to complete the construction of 2 of wells in the villages of Šekhka and Hasan Ava worth of 200,173.89 euros and thanks to donors of Bishops Conference of Slovakia 1 well in the village of Sreshka and start with the construction of another 3 wells, which will be completed in 2022. In cooperation with Bishops Conference of Slovakia, we also helped to support the persecuted Christians in Sulaymaniyah in Iraq and help this community. The support was in the amount of 208,850 euros.

Implementation was possible thanks to: co-financing from the program of Slovak Aid, Bishops Conference of Slovakia and local partners: Shingala Azad, Chaldean Catholic Parish of St. Joseph and Religious Community of al-Khalil.

### Ukraine

We helped: 600+ families

Help was provided to families who had to leave their home because of armed conflict and found shelter in another part of country. Many survived traumas, left with nothing, that's why psychological trainings were carried out together with a local Caritas and we distributed vouchers for food and medicine to the neediest.

**The implementation was possible thanks to:** co-financing from the program of Slovak Aid, financial support through Children's donation project, to individual donors and to local partner Caritas Donetsk.

#### Lebanon

We helped: 20 children and their families

**Value:** € 18,840

We continue to support studies for 20 Palestinian children in the Dbayeh refugee camp. Many families do not have the funds to pay the children's school fees and provide transportation to schools. We want to bring them a piece of hope for improving their lives conditions. In addition, the economic crisis persists in the country.


#### Who is the help for?

#### Vision and mission of the project



#### INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

## To the Supervisory Board and to the General secretary of Slovak Catholic Charity Regis. No. 00 179 132

#### Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Slovak catholic charity, which comprise the balance sheet as at 31 December 2021, and the income statement for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Entity as at 31 December 2021, and its financial performance for the year then ended in accordance with the Act on Accounting No. 431/2002 Coll. as amended (the "Act on Accounting").

#### Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are independent of the Entity in accordance with the provisions of Act No. 423/2015 Coll. on Statutory Audit and on Amendment to and Supplementation of Act No. 431/2002 Coll. on Accounting, as amended (hereinafter the "Act on Statutory Audit") related to ethical requirements, including the Code of Ethics for Auditors that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

#### Responsibilities of Management

Management is responsible for the preparation of the financial statements to give a true and fair view in accordance with the Act on Accounting, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Entity's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting, unless management either intends to liquidate the Entity or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Furthermore, we will disclose whether material misstatements were identified in the annual report based on our understanding of the Company and its position, obtained in the audit of the financial statements.




